

## **Limited Call for Applications: Editorial Fellow**

**HEPATOLOGY** and *Liver Transplantation* 

Submission Deadline: March 31, 2023

<u>HEPATOLOGY</u> and <u>Liver Transplantation</u>, AASLD's flagship journals, are seeking candidates who are interested in a year-long Editorial Fellowship.

#### **Overview**

The Editorial Fellowship is available to trainee members of the AASLD, particularly previous Emerging Liver Scholars, who are interested in gaining more experience in the scholarly publishing and editorial processes. As an editorial fellow, trainees will gain insight about manuscript submission, manuscript editing, response to reviewer comments, manuscript resubmission, and the peer review process under the supervision of experienced journal editors. The editorial fellow will also help generate educational materials to disseminate the information to emerging liver scholars, other interested fellows, and junior faculty.

### **Fellowship Duties and Expectations**

- The fellowship will last for one year
- The time commitment averages about 4 to 6 hours per week
- During the year, the AASLD editorial fellow will:
  - Learn and develop educational content on the process of formatting, submitting, revising, and resubmitting a manuscript
  - Follow select review articles from invitation to submission to publication
  - o Learn how electronic manuscript review systems work

## **Eligibility**

- Applicants should be self-motivated, independent, and have a strong interest in medical publishing, editing, and peer review
- To be eligible for the AASLD Editorial Fellowship, trainees must:
  - Be an AASLD trainee member
  - Preferably have been an Emerging Liver Scholar, but all AASLD trainee members are eligible
  - Be in training\* during the editorial fellowship year
    - First through third year gastroenterology fellows
    - Pilot or fourth year hepatology fellows
  - Have a record of publications in peer-reviewed journals and have strong writing skills

- 1. Curriculum vitae (Please be sure to include the following information):
  - Name
  - Name of current institution and institutional record
  - Current career stage (example: 2nd year in gastroenterology fellowship)
  - List of publications
  - AASLD member status
  - Address
  - Primary phone
  - Email

#### 2. Personal Statement

500-word personal statement that includes a description of your career aspirations, goals for the editorial fellowship year, and your planned research and/or editorial project. Please indicate whether you would like to be considered for HEPATOLOGY, *Liver Transplantation*, or both.

#### 3. Letter of Recommendation

One letter of recommendation is required from a program director or department chair within your fellowship institution.
