

POSTGRADUATE COURSE: A LIFETIME OF LIVER HEALTH

The Postgraduate (PG) course is held on Friday, November 11 and with each of the four parts comprised of three 20-minute scientific discussions followed by 30-minute panel discussions.

This year's PG Course is designed to guide how we approach patients and their liver care by considering not only their current stage in life, but also their medical history and future health needs. By reframing liver care and teaching through the lens of a patient's entire lifetime—genetics, environment, medical history, medications, and exposures—the session will explore age-specific factors, disease progression, screening, extrahepatic contributions, and treatments as part of the continuum.

Through speaker insights, the Course aims to enhance how providers plan and deliver optimal liver-centric health at every stage of life.

BASIC SCIENCE SYMPOSIUM: ENDOTHELIAL CELLS OCCUPY CENTRAL STAGE IN LIVER DISEASE

The Symposium is held on **Friday**, **November 11** and each part is comprised of three 20-minute scientific discussions followed by 30-minute panel discussions.

The Basic Science Symposium will discuss liver endothelial cells (ECs), which are highly specialized and increasingly recognized for their heterogeneity and their role in liver diseases and carcinogenesis. Due to recent advancements in isolation techniques in combination with multiomics studies, our understanding has expanded significantly. Emerging literature highlights that liver ECs are more than vascular barriers—they are critical mediators in various biological processes under both physiological and pathological conditions.

Given these exciting developments, this year's Basic Science Symposium is dedicated to liver ECs is both timely and topical and features four parts:

- PART 1: Endothelial Cells Physiology and Heterogeneity
- PART 2: Endothelial Cells in Acute Liver Injury and Inflammation
- PART 3: Endothelial Cells in Chronic Liver Diseases
- PART 4: Endothelial Cells in Portal Hypertension, Liver fibrosis and Carcinogenesis
