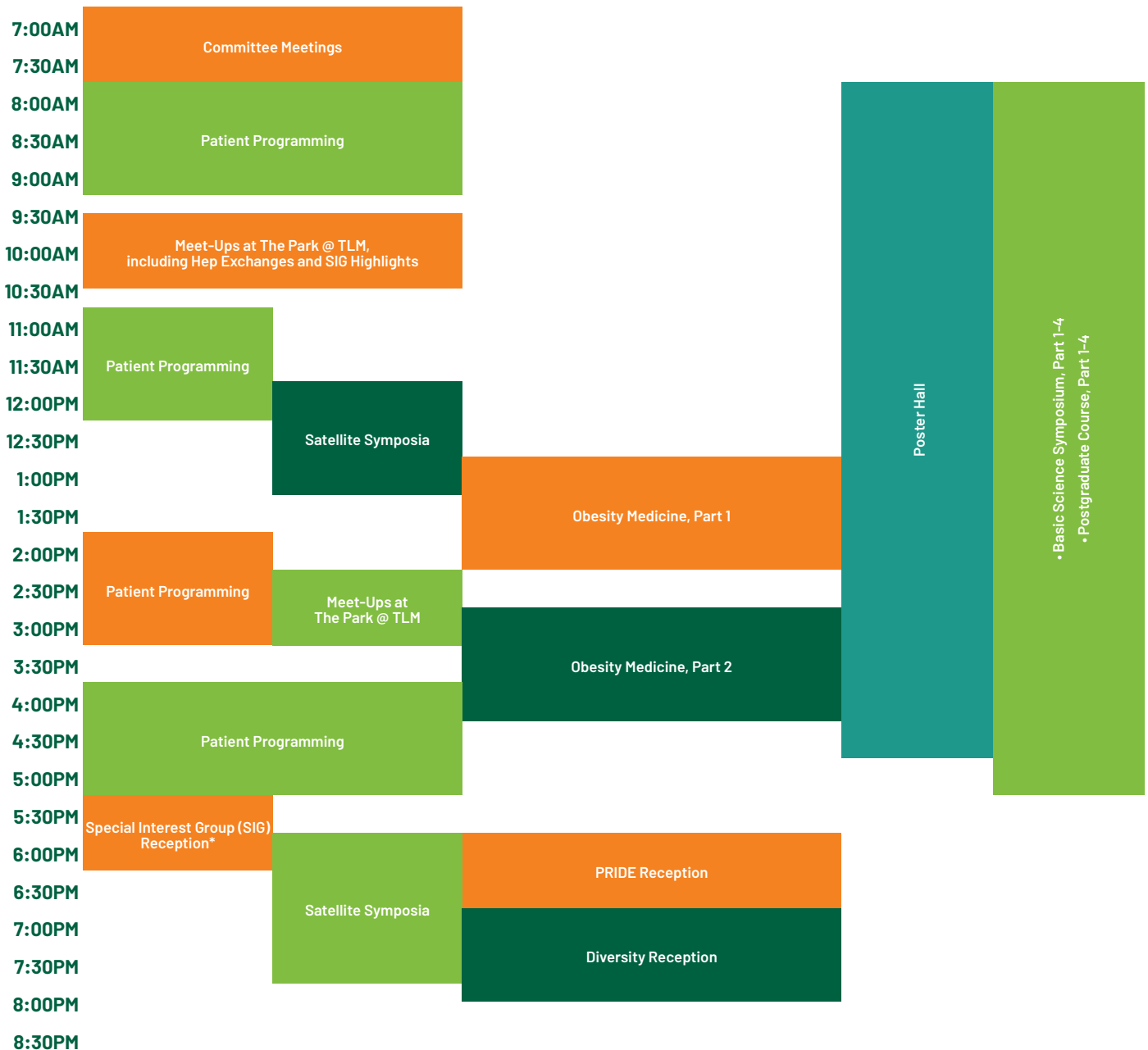

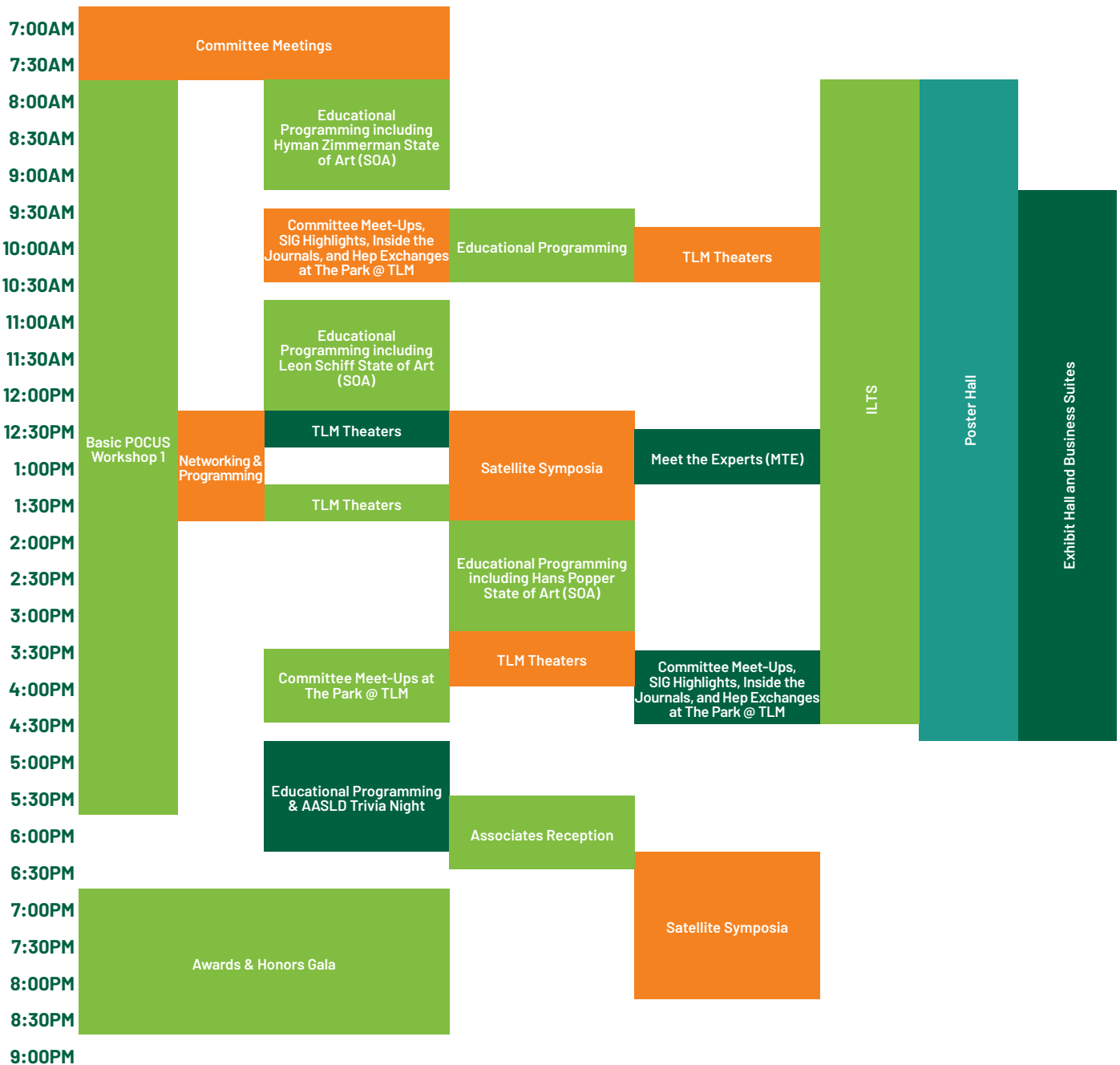

# POSTGRADUATE COURSE, PARTS 1-4: ADVANCING HEPATOLOGY: BREAKTHROUGHS SHAPING TOMORROW'S CARE

Held on Thursday, November 5, the **one-day AASLD Postgraduate course** offers specialized, in-depth training in a four-part series. Each part is made of three 20-minute discussions including a 30-minute panel.

## 8-9:55 AM // PART 1: Liver Fat Comes Out of the Shadows— Transforming Care in Steatotic Liver Disease

Steatotic liver disease now represents the most prevalent spectrum of liver disorders encountered in clinical practice worldwide. Rapid advances in disease nomenclature, epidemiology, pathophysiology, and therapeutics have fundamentally changed how clinicians evaluate and manage these patients. Presenters review the natural history and global burden of steatotic liver disease, focusing on metabolic and alcohol-associated forms.

## 10:15 AM-12:05 PM // PART 2: The Many Ways the Liver Fails— Contemporary Approaches to Decompensation and Failure

Liver failure encompasses a diverse set of clinical syndromes with significant morbidity and mortality. Presenters explore recent advances in understanding the dynamic processes of hepatic decompensation and recompensation. Expert faculty review evidence-based management of portal hypertension complications—ascites, variceal bleeding, and encephalopathy—along with insights into noncirrhotic disease.

## 1:05-2:55 PM // PART 3: We Have a Medicine for That— Navigating Therapeutic Advances in Liver Disease

The pace of therapeutic innovation in hepatology continues to accelerate, creating both opportunity and complexity for practicing clinicians. Presenters focus on areas with the most transformative recent advances and highest impact on patient outcomes. Topics include management of cholestatic liver disease, advances in antiviral therapy, optimization of cirrhosis care, and evolving treatments for liver malignancies.

## 3:15-5 PM // PART 4: Not Every Fix Is a Pill— Innovations Redefining Hepatology Practice

Some of the most impactful advances in hepatology extend beyond pharmacotherapy. Faculty for this forward-looking session highlight innovations reshaping the delivery of liver care. Presenters highlight key innovations in liver care, including telehealth, AI in medical records, noninvasive diagnostics, and machine perfusion in transplantation.

## LEARNING OBJECTIVES



1. Describe the evolving epidemiology and natural history of steatotic liver disease and apply evidence-based strategies for managing metabolic dysfunction-associated and alcohol-associated liver disease, including transplant referral considerations.
2. Implement contemporary approaches to the prevention and management of hepatic decompensation, non-cirrhotic portal hypertension, and acute and chronic liver failure.
3. Integrate recent therapeutic advances in chronic cholestatic liver disease, viral hepatitis, renal dysfunction in cirrhosis, and liver-related oncology into clinical decision-making.
4. Evaluate emerging non-pharmacologic innovations—including AI-enabled tools, non-invasive diagnostics, telehealth, and machine perfusion—for their potential to improve patient outcomes and hepatology practice.

# **BASIC SCIENCE SYMPOSIUM, PARTS 1-4: PROTEIN QUALITY CONTROL, THE UNFOLDED PROTEIN RESPONSE, AND ER STRESS IN ACUTE AND CHRONIC LIVER DISEASE**

Held on **Thursday, November 5**, the one-day Basic Science Symposium course offers attendees the latest scientific development, methodologies, and translational research in four parts.

This course provides a comprehensive exploration of protein quality control mechanisms, focusing on the unfolded protein response (UPR) and endoplasmic reticulum (ER) stress in the context of acute and chronic liver disease. Participants will examine the fundamental biology of ER function in hepatocytes, the role of ER stress in liver injury and disease progression, and its contribution to conditions such as fibrosis and hepatocellular carcinoma. Through a series of expert-led sessions, the course integrates basic science with emerging research advances and highlights potential therapeutic strategies targeting ER stress pathways.

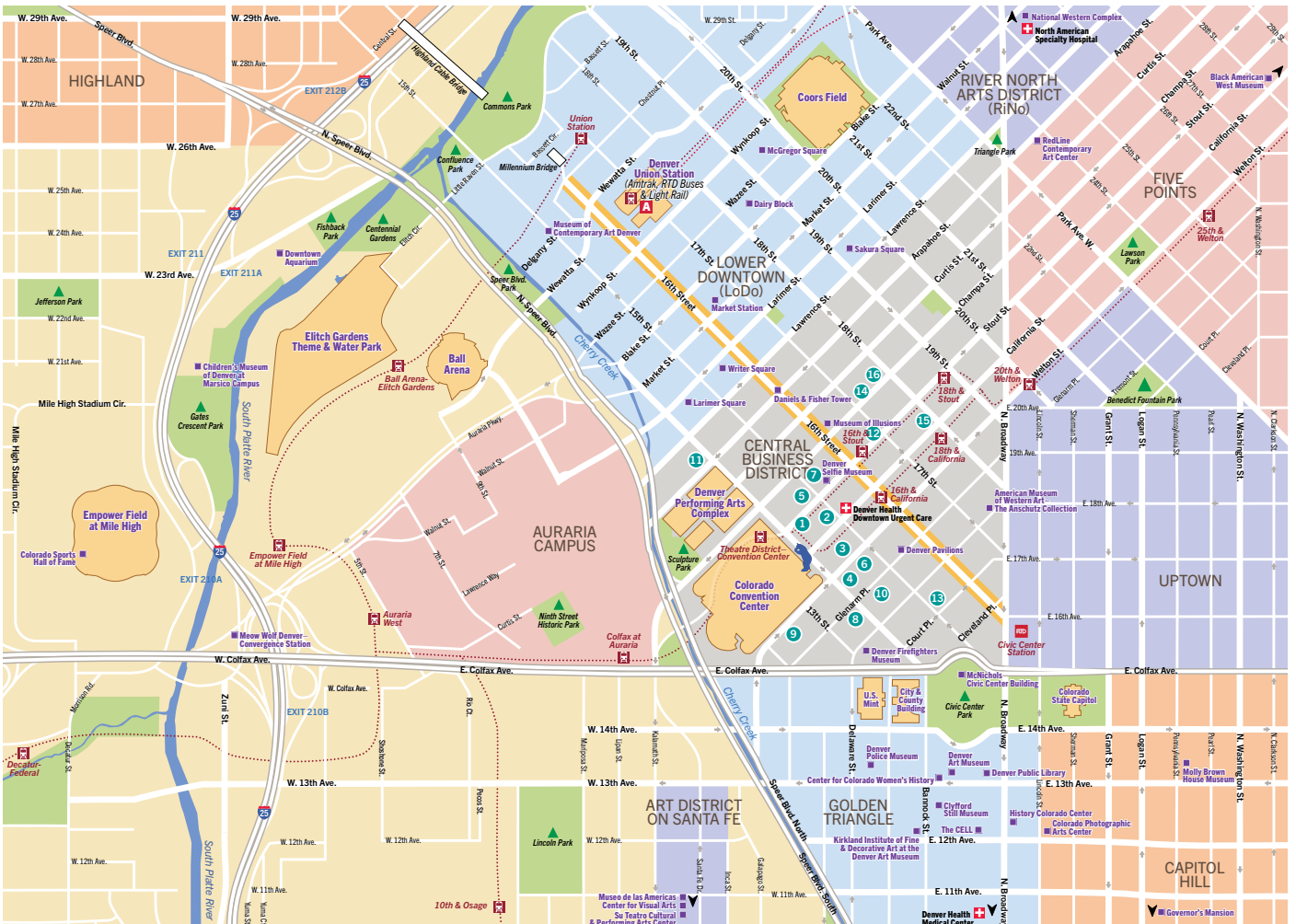
